LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT

English Language Requirements

Non-citizen applicants who obtained their Bachelor's Degree from a university or a higher education institution that does not use English as the medium of instruction for the degree, but wish to follow a Master's Degree program and/or write their dissertation in English are required to meet the English language competency requirements set by the university such as stated in the paragraph below.

Non-citizen applicants who wish to pursue a Master's Degree programme (except certain programmes in the Faculty of Languages & Linguistics and all programmes in the Faculty of Medicine) must obtain at least the following results for one of the English language proficiency examinations specified below:

- i. A minimum score of 550 for Paper-based Test (PBT), a score of 213 for Computer-based Test (CBT) or a score of 80 for Internet-based Test (IBT) in the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL);
- ii. A minimum score of Band 5.5 for the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) (Academic);
- iii. If the language testing system in the programme is higher than (i) and (ii), then the score is according to the standard set by the programme;
- iv. For any programme standard which sets the lower TOEFL or IELTS (Academic) score than what had been constituted by the University, these programmes have to follow the minimum score set by the University;
- v. A minimum score of 42 Pearson Test of Academic English (PTE Academic);
- vi. A minimum of grade C for English General Certificate of Education (A-Level);
- vii. A minimum of grade C for Cambridge English: First (FCE);
- viii. A minimum of grade C for Cambridge English: Advance (CAE);
- ix. A minimum of grade C for Cambridge English: Proficiency (CPE); or
- x. A minimum of band 4 for Malaysian University English Test (MUET).

Notwithstanding the provision above, the Faculty may consider English language qualifications/competencies other than those specified in paragraph (1) above, subject to Senate approval and based on the requirements of the Master's Degree programme.

Non-citizen applicants with the following backgrounds are exempt from the stated English language qualification requirements;

- (a) whose country of origin uses English Language as the National Language;
- (b) whose academic qualification comes from an institution that uses only the English Language as the medium of instruction; or
- (c) have studied in Malaysia and intend to continue their studies to a higher level subject to the requirement in (b);

Malay Language Requirements

The basic qualification requirements for Malay Language Competency are as follows:

1. Non-citizen applicants are required to meet the Bahasa Malaysia requirements before the degree conferment.
2. Non-citizen applicants who have attended a Public Higher Education Institution (IPTA) in Malaysia and plan to continue their studies to a higher level are exempt from condition (1).

ENTRY REQUIREMENT

General Entry Requirements:

Possess a Bachelor's Degree in al-Quran and al-Hadith / Islamic Studies / any other related field with a CGPA of 3.00/4.00.

OR

Possess a Bachelor's Degree in al-Quran and al-Hadith / Islamic Studies / any other related field with a CGPA of 2.50 - 2.99 and;

The applicant must fulfil at least one (1) of the following criteria:

- 1) Universiti Malaya graduate or;
- 2) Has at least one (1) year of work experience in related fields or;
- 3) Has produced publications in related fields or;
- 4) A scholarship recipient or;
- 5) A staff member of a government agency or;
- 6) Pass an interview conducted by the Faculty or;
- 7) Pass a special evaluation by the Faculty.
